RETENTION

Just as important as recruitment

Retention is defined as the ability to keep or continue having something. It seems that in District 5SE this concept is not being engaged actively by Lions Clubs.

Our District has the poorest membership retention statistics within our multiple district. How do we keep Lions engaged or interested in participating/remaining in their clubs? Have you done a club assessment or survey lately?

LCI has a lot of tools to use for retention of members as well as recruiting new members. The district's goal this year was to end the year with a positive membership growth.



How is your club doing? Now is a good time to recruit new members as the yearly dues is decreased to one-quarter of the amount plus the new member fee. Continue to ask members of your community to attend a service project and sign them up for membership.

Try and partner with other organizations like the volunteer fire department or the local athletic boosters in a service project.

Ask, Ask, Ask. But we must remember to Listen, Listen, Listen as well. Members need to feel a sense of belonging and this may require us "old timers" to see things from a different perspective.

I have faith that we can end the year with a positive membership number.

Remember to update all information in MyLion or MyLCI by May 31. Club secretaries, please ask for updated phone, address and emails of all members and update them in LCI. If you need help with this, please contact Jennie Braaten or PDG Joan Marlette for assistance.

Also, please be sure to enter Officers for 2023-24 in LCI by May 15. Even if they are the same as the previous year, they need to be entered into the program for the next year.

All club members, please hold your president and secretary accountable to do this. Communication is difficult enough, but when all contact information is outdated, it puts the entire district at a standstill.

Finally, if you are having difficulty finding officers for your club, you may want to try a "team" for some offices. LCI allows you to enter only one name, but maybe a seasoned officer can be "official" and a newer leader in training can be the assistant and plan to take over in the future.

I hope spring will finally arrive and I will see you all in Brookings on April 1.

Take on the **United Nations** On March 3, there were five Fargo Gateway Lions in New York city to experience Lions Day at the UN. District Governor Scott Hildre, Miriam Hildre, Fowzia Adde/ from Somalia, Jihan Brifki/ from Kurdistan, and myself. (DG Dave Butler and I had attended this event in March 1996.)

During introductions of International Lion officials, two New Voices global leaders were named: Joyce Middleton from the U.S. and Elisabeth Haderer from the Netherlands. We had met in Montreal with PIP Gudrun Yngvadottir during a New Voices seminar with an international audience.

They were also at the US/Canada Forum in Calgary, Joyce was the moderator and facilitator Elisabeth leading a New Voices seminar titled: From Initiative to Movement- New Voices are telling great stories about service activities, getting into leadership positions, and strive for diversity in membership, leadership, service and marketing.

After the closure of the UN session, DG Scott Hildre, Lion Miriam Hildre, and I attended a reception back at our hotel. Global leaders was accessible; I was able to speak with Joyce about all the New Voices activity in our MD5 region.
