LCIF Contributions can help District 5SE

In August, District 5SE was notified that through generous district club and personal contributions to LCIF last year, the district could apply for up to \$18,000 in District Impact Grant money. It was determined by the District 5SE officers/cabinet that new vision screeners for our Lions Kidsight Program were an immediate need as many of our current screeners are "on their last leg."

The screeners are very expensive, so the grant money may only purchase 2-3. However, even 2-3 new screeners will allow Lions to continue the yearly screening of 37,000+ children through the South Dakota Lions Kidsight Program. I will let you know if we have been approved for the grant as soon as I hear!

Remember to elect your new club officers in March. Is your club thinking about adding a membership chairperson? How about a social media chairperson?

Maybe your club needs a service project chairperson. Your club, your way — be creative.

One of PDG Paul's goals his District Governor year was to bring in 40 new Members under 40. PDG Paul was successful in his endeavor!

To date we have started three clubs in Area "C" with 2 clubs pending. Our goal for this year is 33 new clubs, we have five months to try and at least accomplish half of our goal.

To date our membership goals are on track and we should as an area meet those numbers. Our retention is not as successful as our new member goals as is our goal for positive growth in our area.

We cannot dwell on what has happened, we need to look forward to what we can accomplish before the end of the year. Together we can, together we will.

At the end of the first six months of the Lions year we inducted over 80,000 new members into Lions, the bad news is we lost over 100,000 members. However, at the end of the first six months we had a positive growth worldwide.

This was accomplished by the fact that we started enough new clubs in the first six months to have a positive growth. It is very evident that starting new clubs and working on retention will turn our membership issue around.

Many times those that are leaving in the over 66 categories are leaving because of illness, moving to warmer climates or are now living in a nursing home or assisted living and are unable to help or function as a Lion.

We don't want to abandon them but we need to find new and creative ways they can serve.

Present a 'Life Vac'

Alcester Lions Club hosted several members of the Alcester Community for a presentation of a "Life Vac" at the regular Alcester Lions Club meeting on Feb. 19. Lion John Wegh organized the purchase and presentation of the "Life Vac" to our Alcester Community Institutions.

The "Life Vac" is a lifesaving device that aids in removing an object that is causing choking in either adults or children. Easy to use, it simply requires depressing the plunger to create a vacuum, then pull the plunger back up to suck the object out.

This life-saving device was invented and produced by Arthur Lih in Nesconset, New York. The "Life Vac" is suitable for home and commercial use and can be purchased as a travel kit for vehicles.

Once the device is used to remove an item that is causing choking, "Life Vac" guarantees that they will send a replacement device at no cost. More information and training videos about "Life Vac" can be found on their website at www.lifevac.net.
